There's no shortage of challenges we have faced over the past 18 months, whether personal, professional or as a community. Calls to mental health crisis lines have increased dramatically. The number of homeless individuals and families has tripled from last year. At its peak, 600 calls were placed

daily for rent and utility assistance in the fall. It's a lot to grasp and comprehend.

The one thing we know is that United Way of East Central lowa is committed to being at the forefront of collective solutions to make where we live a better place for all. And it's because of you and your support.

This past year your generosity allowed us to be instrumental in pulling together a more effective and efficient rent and utility assistance system. Together, we streamlined ten applications and phone numbers down to one and started collecting data to make better informed decisions

as a community. We also led the way in our 21-Day Equity Challenge, helping educate thousands of people through daily emails in the month of September. And we'll continue to be here for our community, focusing on the most pressing of emerging issues such as affordable housing and accessible childcare.
