When we support Safety Net Services, we want to "catch" individuals and families and help them bounce back if they fall onto challenging times. Recently in our community, there has been an increase in the number of individuals served by local emergency shelters and transitional housing facilities, and more working families needing access to food pantries.

At United Way, we are addressing these issues through engaging and mobilizing community members to create a community where everyone feels secure. As a leader in the Alliance for Equitable Housing, we are a part of the homeless systems redesign, which is working to identify barriers and implement effective strategies for our community.

From this work, the Landlord Tenant Success Initiative aims to foster strong tenant-landlord relationships by successfully accomodating 30 housing-challenged tenants with private, for-profit landlords within Linn County. Additionally, we are supporting families and individuals by educating and promoting 211, a free service that helps you find a variety of resources. Through this combined effort, along with others, we are fostering a thriving Eastern lowa.

COLLEGIATE BOLD

Using our voices to advocate for what matters most is essential. Our Collegiate BOLD program provides college students in Linn County with the opportunity to develop the fundamental skills needed to serve on junior boards and student organizations, empowering them to advocate and make a difference in our community. What started at Kirkwood Community College, quickly expanded to Mount Mercy University, Coe College, and Our Future to encourage more students to be community driven individuals. Our Future is a paid fellowship program that equips emerging leaders with the tools they need to be valued and empowered advocates for justice, sustainability, and equity. Emily Grace, a Collegiate BOLD advisor, said she encourages students to join because it provides students an opportunity to get involved, step up, and lead.
