#### **MAKING HEALTHCARE EASIER TO REACH**

In rural communities, accessing healthcare can be a challenge – especially for seniors. Through targeted programs, UWECI is making it easier for seniors to navigate and access the care they need.

Our Transportation Program provides reliable transportation to medical appointments outside of rural counties, ensuring seniors have access to the care they need, when and where they need it.

Additionally, our Senior Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP) provides counseling to seniors with questions about Medicare, long-term care insurance, and more, empowering them to make informed decisions about their healthcare coverage.

Together, these programs increase access and help seniors stay healthy and independent.
